**THE LATE MRS. A. B. HONEYFIELD**



Mrs. Alice B. Honeyfield, whose death occurred in Sydney on July 15, was a generous giver for both public and private purposes. The town of New Plymouth, where she spent her married life, benefited by her generosity on a number of occasions, her gifts including a drinking fountain on the Esplanade, two tramway shelters (one at the railway station and the other at Hobson Street), new gates for Te Henui Cemetery, children's paddling pool at Kawaroa Park, show-cases for the Early Colonists' Room at the Museum, and contributions to the Y.W.C.A., the gates at Western Park, and the Fitzroy School War Memorial. When her husband, Mr. Henry J. Honeyfield, died over 30 years ago, Mrs. Honeyfield went abroad and

she did not again take up her residence in New Plymouth, though showing her continued interest in the town in the practical way which has been mentioned.
