

Of late a number of new buildings have been erected in Stratford to replace others which have become too small for the demands of the businesses which were housed therein. Several handsome new structures have been put up within the last few months, and these have made a very great improvement to the appearance of the town. Another up-to-date building is to be erected, this time at the corner of Fenton and Juliet Streets for Mr D. J. Malone, who finds his present premises quite inadequate for the growing requirements of his business. It will be constructed in concrete, and a glance at the plans shows the design to be a pleasing one. Although the premises will be of one storey only, provision has been made for the addition of another at a later date if such should become necessary. The whole of the section will be taken up by the new structure, which will contain a warehouse, bottling store, cordial factory, and the usual offices. The architect, Mr John D. Healy, will call for tenders for the erection of the new premises at once.
