



THESE TWO BUILDINGS on the corner of Gover and Devon Sts, New Plymouth, are to be replaced by the owner, the Bank of New Zealand. Plans for redevelopment were announced today.

New bank premises planned

The Bank of New Zealand plans to redevelop two old properties it owns on the corner of Gover and Devon Sts in New Plymouth.

BNZ manager, Mr J. T. Williamson, announced today that the bank planned to rebuild on the site about the middle of next year.

The present buildings were a fruitshop and an agency of the bank. The agency would continue there in the new premises. It was not yet decided what the new building would comprise and as yet there was no estimate available of the cost.

He said the buildings were both due for demolition. The new building would enable the bank's agency to carry out business in premises which were a credit to the bank.
