Taranaki Newspapers Ltd staff moved into the new building today.

The main counter, advertising, circulation, Sunday Express, administration and management departments

also moved next door into the company's newly-completed Currie St premises today.

The public entrance has not altered for those wanting to place advertisements or pay accounts.

The commercial print en-

trance is still in Powderham St.

The Taranaki Herald reporters will stay in their temporary premises in nearby Roebuck House until late November, when Daily News reporters will vacate the Herald building and return to their refurbished and

air-conditioned offices.

This is the second major move associated with the \$1.7 million new building.

The first was in August last year when the Taranaki Herald reporters and the ledgers departments moved into Roebuck House across

the road. Subeditors shared the Daily News editorial quarters.

The third and final move is expected when the two floors of the Daily News building is completely renovated by late November-early December.
