**AN ORDINANCE**  
**TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF THE SCOTCH THISTLE.**

**Analysis.**

Title.	allowing Thistle to flower on road.
Preamble.	
1—Penalty for allowing Scotch Thistle to flower.	4—Who shall be deemed occupiers.
2—New offence after conviction what shall be deemed.	5—Lands whereon Thistle is growing may be entered upon for purpose of destroying same.
3—Penalty on occupiers of adjacent lands for al-	6—Commencement of operation.

*AN ORDINANCE to prevent the spread of the Scotch Thistle.*

*Whereas it is expedient to make provision against the spread of a noxious weed called the Scotch Thistle.*

*Be it enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of New Plymouth with the Advice and Consent of the Provincial Council thereof as follows:—*

1—Every occupier of Land who, after

this Ordinance shall have come into operation, shall suffer the weed called Scotch Thistle to flower upon the land in his occupation, shall for every such offence forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding the sum of £5.

2—If any person after the expiration of seven days from his conviction for the said offence shall suffer the said weed to flower or continue in flower upon the Tenement in respect of which such his prior convic-

tion took place, he shall be deemed to have committed a new offence.

3—In case the occupier of any land abutting on a Road shall permit the said weed to go to flower on the half of such road adjacent to his land and bounded by the middle line of the road, he shall be liable to the like penalty as if he had suffered the said weed to flower on land in his own occupation.

4—As respects land not actually occupied the Owner thereof shall for the purposes of this Ordinance be deemed the occupier. Licensees under an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council passed in the second Session of the said Council intituled "An Ordinance to regulate the occupation of certain unenclosed lands in the Town of New Plymouth" shall not be deemed occupiers for the purposes of this Ordinance of the lands comprised in their respective licenses.

5—It shall be lawful for any person to enter upon any lands whatsoever on which the said weed may be growing, for the purpose of destroying the same, or the flower thereof—so that the person so entering do no unnecessary damage.

6—This Ordinance shall come into operation at the expiration of 14 days from the passing thereof.
