DEATH OF MR. R. T. MCQUADE

Mr. Robert Thorburn McQuade, who was well-known in business and sporting circles, died in New Plymouth on Tuesday. A few months ago ill-health forced his retirement from business.

He was formerly well-known as a yachtsman and in later life as a golfer and racehorse owner.

Mr. McQuade came to New Plymouth in 1913 as branch manager of the firm of Macky Logan, which he joined on his return from Sydney where he had begun his warehouse training after completing his education at Thames, his birthplace.

He joined the Taranaki Club, the New Plymouth Golf Club and the Taranaki Jockey Club, in which he held office for many years.

Mr. McQuade managed Mackey Logan's New Plymouth branch until its liquidation in the 1930s, after which he formed his own warehouse.

He is survived by his wife.
