AN ORDINANCE to extend and facilitate the remedy for recovery of rates made under the Public Works Ordinance.

Whereas it is expedient to extend the remedy for recovery of rates made under an Ordinance of the Superintendent and Provincial Council passed in this present session of the said Council, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the maintenance of Public Works within the Province of New Plymouth."

Be it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of New Plymouth, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, as follows:—

1. Every Order which may be made by any Justice of the Peace under the provisions of the recited Ordinance for payment of rates (with or without the costs of any proceedings rendered necessary by non-payment of such rates) may be enforced by distress and sale of any of the goods and chattels of the person against whom such Order shall be made, in the same manner as Orders for payment of money made by

any Justice of the Peace in cases of summary conviction are by law made enforceable.

2. The Lists of Ratepayers published by the Commissioners pursuant to the 20th section of the said Ordinance, or where any such list shall have been issued and recalled, the last issued of such lists, being revised by the Commissioners as in the said Ordinance is appointed, shall in any proceeding for the recovery of rates be conclusive evidence against the Defendant that he is rateable in the amount in which by such revised List he appears to be rated; unless it is proved on his behalf that subsequently to the day appointed for hearing objections to the said List, and before the day appointed for payment of the monies sought to be recovered, he ceased to be Owner or Occupier (as the case may be) of the lands rated. And in any such proceeding it shall be open to show that the Defendant is actually chargeable in the amount sought to be recovered notwithstanding that his name may not appear in the List of Ratepayers, or that he may in such List appear charge-

able in a less amount, and notwithstanding any informality in such List, or in the publication thereof.

3. This Ordinance shall be read and construed as forming part of the recited Ordinance.

Whereas it having been in contemplation, under and by virtue of the provisions of an Ordinance of the Governor-in-chief and late	

cified in the Schedules to this Ordinance, certain lines of public roads particularised in the same Schedules, and the compensation payable in Government scrip to the owners and occupiers of the lands required for the construction of such roads hath been fixed in the manner provided by the said Ordinance at the sums set opposite the respective names of such owners and occupiers in the said Schedules; but such scrip hath not been issued, and doubts exist whether the same can now legally be issued by the Governor of the colony. *And whereas* it is expedient that the Superintendent of the Province should be authorised to cause the aforesaid lines of road to be constructed and to issue to the aforesaid owners and occupiers the amount of Government scrip fixed for their respective compensation as aforesaid. *And whereas* the said lines of road have been delineated on a map constructed for that purpose and deposited in the office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands at New Plymouth in which map the said lines of roads are coloured pink:

Be it therefore enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of New Plymouth, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, as follows—

1. It shall be lawful for the Superintendent to cause a road to be constructed upon and across each of the sections specified or referred to in the Schedules to this Ordinance in the line indicated for that purpose in the said map in manner aforesaid, and to cause to be executed upon the said sections all necessary works for that purpose.

2. The said Roads shall be public Roads and the fee simple of the soil thereof, free from all incumbrances, shall forthwith vest in the Superintendent and devolve upon his successors in office in like manner as if the same had been duly granted to him by the Governor as a Public Reserve under the provisions of the Public Reserves Act 1854.

3. The Superintendent shall forthwith issue to the several persons named in the said Schedules respectively Scrip to the amount set opposite their respective names in the same Schedules, which shall be available in the purchase of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Province in like manner and on the same terms and conditions as other Government Scrip issued in respect

of the settlement of New Plymouth is now by law available for such purpose.
