

Remembrance cross to be dedicated

Last night members of the New Plymouth Returned Services Association accepted an invitation from the Waitara sub-branch to attend the dedication of the cross of remembrance erected in the soldiers' cemetery at Waitara.

The cross is to be dedicated by the Ven. G. H. Gavin, Archdeacon of Taranaki, on Sunday afternoon.

Mr. W. D. Saunders, retiring president, and Mr. H. A. J. Haslop, the new president of the New Plymouth association, paid tribute last night to the splendid voluntary work done by Waitara R.S.A. members in erecting the very fine memorial.

All the stone work on the memorial has been done by Waitara R.S.A. members. The memorial has a four foot base, tapered to two feet at the top, near which is inset a cross which will be illuminated at night when power is available.

A wall of coloured Te Kuiti stone flanks the memorial, which is at the northern end of the soldiers' plots, and neat garden plots are arranged on each side.
