TARANAKI MILITIA REGULATIONS.

BY virtue and in exercise of the authority in me vested by the Militia Act, 1858, and the Militia Act Amendment Act, 1860, I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby make and issue the following orders for the regulation of the Taranaki Regiment of Militia.

1. The Taranaki Militia District shall not be divided, but the Taranaki Regiment shall constitute one Battalion.

2. Such Battalion shall be divided into three classes.

3. The first-class shall consist of all unmarried men and all widowers without children between the ages of sixteen years

and forty years, both inclusive, who shall be called the first-class service men. The second class shall consist of all married men and widowers with children between the same ages, who shall be called second class service men; and the third class shall consist of all men between the ages of forty years and fifty-five years, who shall be called the reserve men.

4. The men of each class shall be formed by the Senior Officer of the Battalion into one or more Company or Companies, he having regard in such formation to secure, as far as possible, contiguity of residence of the men in each Company.

PROCLAMATION.

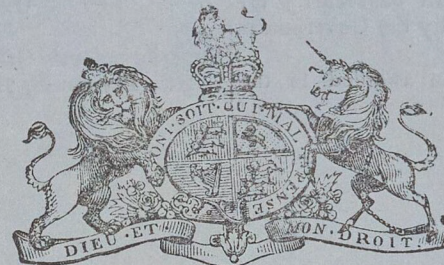
By CHARLES BROWN, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Imperial Parliament passed in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent to prorogue the Provincial Council, from time to time, whenever he shall deem it expedient so to

do. Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do proclaim and declare that, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said Act, I do hereby prorogue the Provincial Council of Taranaki, and that the said Provincial Council is prorogued accordingly.

PROCLAMATION.

By CHARLES BROWN, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled the "Superintendent's Deputy Act, 1856," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Superintendent of any Province, by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* of such Province, to appoint such person as he may think fit, being a registered elector of such Province, to be his Deputy, and as such to perform and exercise all the acts and powers (except such powers as are conferred by the Constitution Act, 15 and 16 Vic., c. 72) which may be exercised and performed by such Superintendent, or such of them only as shall be specified in such proclamation. Now, therefore, I, the Superintendent of the Province of Taranaki, do hereby appoint

EDWARD LARWILL HUMPHRIES, Esquire,
Speaker of the Provincial Council,

to be my Deputy during my absence from the said Province, and as such to perform and exercise all the acts and powers appertaining to the office of Superintendent, except such as are conferred by the Constitution Act.

GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE FOR BUILDINGS.

APPLICANTS for assistance in the shape of funds, timber, or labor, will make their application in a form supplied from this office, in which the applicant will undertake, That

1. The Building shall be erected within the lines, or within such extension of them as may be approved by the Officer Commanding H.M. Troops in the Province.

2. If in streets or public places, in such sites as may be pointed out by the Surveyor of the Province.

3. The Building shall be built in a sound, workmanlike manner, and for sanitary considerations shall be raised three clear feet off the ground.

4. The Building shall be security for the amount advanced by the Government until repaid.

5. Any compensation awarded to the

applicant shall, in the first instance, be applied to defraying the amount advanced.

GARRISON STANDING ORDERS.

The following Orders will be strictly attended to should it be necessary on any alarm to sound the "Assembly:"—

1. The "Assembly" is to sound only by order of the officer commanding the garrison, of the field officer, or garrison officer of the day, or by order of the garrison adjutant.

N.B.—Should the alarm be occasioned by a fire in the Town the "Assembly" only will sound. The 57th regiment will get under arms, but the Militia and Volunteers living in the Town will not be required to turn out with arms.

2. Should the alarm be occasioned by any other cause the "Assembly" followed by the "Alarm" will sound, and the whole of the troops in garrison (regular and militia) will get under arms and assemble as quickly as possible at their respective alarm posts.

2. Under any circumstances on the "Assembly" being sounded the 57th regt. will fall in at their several barracks and await orders, with the exception of No. 7 company which will be marched to the north gate on the Devon road and receive their orders from Major Butler, 57th regt.

3. The Militia and Volunteers will assemble as under.

The Town will be divided into three (3) divisions, viz.:

1st. The Militia and Volunteers living in No. 1 division, or on the north and east of the gate on the Devon road will assemble at Captain Stapp's house, Devon line road.

2nd. The Militia and Volunteers living in No. 2 division, or within the ordinary limits of the Town, will assemble at the Militia office, Mount Eliot.

3rd. The Militia and Volunteers living south and west of the gate on Devon road will assemble at the south gate.

4. The undermentioned officers will command the several divisions, and as they are responsible for the disposition of the force under their command, and that the instructions they receive are carried out, all orders given by them are to be strictly and promptly obeyed, viz.:

No. 1 or north division—Major Butler, 57th Regt.

No. 2 or centre division—Major Herbert, Militia and Volunteers.

No. 3 or South division—Major Harsard, 57th Regt.

Brevet-Major St. Clair, 57th Regiment, will command the reserve at Marsland hill, and will receive his orders from the officer commanding the garrison.

5. An officer or an intelligent non-commissioned officer (mounted if possible) from each division will be sent to the garrison

office to convey orders and act as orderly to the officer commanding the garrison.

6. The troops occupying the several Blockhouses will get under arms on the occasion of any alarm, and remain within their defences until regularly dismissed.

7. The Royal Artillery and Royal Engineers will receive their orders from the officer commanding the garrison at the garrison office.

8. On the occasion of any alarm, particularly at night, it is absolutely necessary to avoid confusion, and preserve the utmost regularity within the Town. The Colonel commanding, and the officers commanding the different divisions will secure the safety of the inhabitants from all ordinary danger, but the inhabitants must second their endeavours and keep their families from quitting their houses and straggling about the streets. Women and children are much safer in their houses than they can possibly be in the streets, and it is earnestly requested under every circumstance of night alarm that they extinguish all lights and keep themselves quietly within their houses.

9. Patrols will be sent out from the different divisions to assist out-lying settlers within the lines, in the event of occasion requiring this precaution.

10. Public houses will be closed for the sale of liquor during the continuance of any alarm.
