WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The

Militia Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Militia Districts, and such Districts from time to time to vary, and to designate the Militia of any such District by the name of a Regiment, Battalion, Corps, or Company;

Now, therefore, his Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the above recited power, doth, by this present order, constitute four several Militia Districts, to be called and known by the names following, namely,—
Auckland Country,
Taranaki,
Wellington, and
Napier,

and doth define the respective boundaries of the said districts, as follows:

Of the Auckland Country District, the circumference of a circle, whereof the radius extends twenty miles from the present police office in the city of Auckland, excepting therefrom the Militia District, constituted by order in Council of the twelfth day of November, 1858, published in the *New Zealand Gazette* of the thirtieth day of the same month.

Of the Taranaki District, the circumference of a circle, the radius of which extends twenty miles from the present police office in the town of New Plymouth.

Of the Wellington District, the circumference of a circle, whereof the radius extends twenty miles from the police office in the city of Wellington.

Of the Napier District, the circumference of a circle, whereof the radius extends twenty miles from the police office in the town of Napier.

And doth designate the Militia within each of the said Districts by the name of a Battalion.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Militia Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time to make, vary, and abolish Regulations under which the services of Volunteers shall be accepted in any Militia District. Now, therefore, his Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the colony, and in exercise of the powers in this behalf vested in him by the said recited Act, doth hereby make and ordain the following Regulations, under which the services of volunteers shall be accepted in the District of Taranaki.

1. The term of service for each Volunteer to be one year from the day he is sworn in; provided always that if any Volunteer shall go to reside out of the district, he shall, if he desire, be discharged from further service as a Volunteer.

2. Every Volunteer shall attend to be trained and exercised at such time and place as shall be fixed by the Governor or by such person or persons as he may from time to time authorise in that behalf: Provided also that no Volunteer shall be compelled to attend to be trained or exercised more than one hundred and sixty-eight hours in any one year.

3. All officers of companies will be appointed by the Governor, and names for that purpose are to be submitted to him for his approval by the company to which they are proposed to be appointed.

4. The Adjutant and Staff Serjeant of the Taranaki Militia will act as Adjutant and Serjeant Major respectively to the Volunteers of the district, and all Serjeants and Corporals must be examined and passed as competent by the Adjutant before they will be appointed.

5. All rolls, documents, and correspondence, shall be kept at the office of the Adjutant, and shall be open at all times during office hours for the inspection and information of the officers of the company to which they relate.

6. All orders and communications from the Governor or Government of the Colony shall be transmitted through and given out by the Adjutant.

7. Every Volunteer who shall absent himself during any part of the time appointed for training or exercise, and shall not account for such absence to the satisfaction of the Adjutant and the Captain of his company, shall forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding one pound for every day on which he shall be so absent.

8. If any arms, accoutrements, ammunition, or other Government property shall be injured, destroyed, or expended, by being used except on service, the Volunteer in whose charge such arms, accoutrements, ammunition, or other property were at the time, shall pay a sum not exceeding the value of the same respectively.

9. Every Volunteer who shall appear at drill without the appointed arms, accoutrements, and dress, or any part thereof, or with the same in a dirty or neglected state, shall pay a sum not exceeding ten shillings for every such offence.

10. Every Volunteer who shall be guilty of inattention or carelessness, or who shall misbehave himself at drill in any manner not before specified, shall pay a sum not exceeding twenty shillings nor less than five shillings for every such offence.

11. All such fines shall be fixed by the Captain and Adjutant and shall be paid to the Adjutant on demand, and if not so paid they may be recovered in a summary way by him on behalf of the Government in any Resident Magistrate's Court in

the Colony.

12. Volunteers enrolled under these Regulations shall be subject to the provisions contained in the following sections of "The Militia Act, 1858," namely, sections 1, 3, 6, 7, 9, 18, 19, 20, 21 except the proviso thereto, 22, 23 except when accepted when assembled for the purpose of being trained and exercised only, and 24.

WHEREAS by the "District Courts Act, 1858," it is provided that there shall be within the Colony Courts of Record possessing Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction, to be called 'District Courts,' and the Governor is empowered from time to time by notification in the *New Zealand Gazette* to fix the time and places within the District at which every such Court shall be held.

Now, therefore, I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony, do hereby, in pursuance and execution of the said power and authority, fix that a Session of the District Court of Otago shall be held at Dunedin, in the Province of Otago; and a session of the District Court of Taranaki at New Plymouth, in the Province of Taranaki, on the fifteenth day of March next, respectively.

PENCARROW LIGHTHOUSE.

Notice is hereby given, that on and after the first day of January next a new light will be exhibited on Pencarrow Head at the entrance of Port Nicholson (Wellington), Cook's Strait, New Zealand.

The new light will be of the second order (Cadioptric system), with eclipses at intervals of two minutes; it will be 420 feet above high water mark, and visible in ordinary weather at a distance of thirty English miles.

The following are the magnetic bearings and distances of the site of the new Lighthouse.

From Baring Head, N.W. by N., 3½ miles.
From Sinclair Head, E. by N. ½ N. 6½ miles.
From Outer Rock of Barrett's Reef, S.E. by E. ½ E., 1 mile.
From Steeple Rock, S.S.E., 2 miles.
From Cape Campbell, N.N.E. ¼ E., 33 miles.

The Lighthouse is in Latitude 41° 22' 0" S., Longitude 174° 51' 15" E.

WHEREAS by the "District Courts Act, 1858," it is enacted that there shall be, within the Colony of New Zealand, Courts of Record possessing Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction, to be called District Courts, and the Governor is empowered from time to time, as he shall think fit, by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, to constitute throughout the Colony, or in any part thereof, Districts within which such Courts shall be respectively held, and such Districts to abolish, and the boundaries thereof to define or alter, and also to declare by what local name each such Court shall be designated.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance and execution of the aforesaid authority do hereby proclaim and constitute the Province of TARANAKI to be a District within which a District Court shall be held under the said Act.

And in further pursuance and exercise of the authority aforesaid, I do hereby declare that the aforesaid Court shall be designated by the name of "The District Court of Taranaki."

PROVINCIAL COUNCIL.

THE Superintendent opened the 7th Session of the Provincial Council at the Council Chamber on Monday, the 7th instant, at $\frac{1}{2}$ past 10 o'clock, a.m., and delivered the following

ADDRESS.

Mr. Speaker, and Gentlemen of the Provincial Council,—

Acting upon a Resolution of the Council passed at the close of the last session, I have called you together at the earliest period that the public accounts for the past year could be laid before you in a complete form. These, together with the Estimates for the present year, will now be laid before you.

I am aware that the present time of meeting must be inconvenient to most of you, but the business requiring your immediate attention is considerable.

Two Resolutions, to be concurred in by the Superintendent, will be required to give effect to the Resolutions of the last session with respect to letting the sea beach and land contiguous thereto, for the purpose of working the iron sand ore—one recommending his Excellency the Governor to execute a lease of the sea beach; and the other signifying your approval of a lease of the adjoining land, to be executed under the 41st clause of the Land Regulations.

These are the only measures which I propose to submit to you at the present time in addition to the bill providing for the public expenditure for the year 1859.

It is my intention afterwards to prorogue the Council for a short period, when I shall lay before you several measures for your consideration, including bills for contracting the Town and providing for new lines of roads.

A new Court House and Gaol are urgently required, but the outlay necessary for their erection is beyond the present means of the Province. I trust, however, with the aid of the General Government, at the commencement of the next session to be enabled to lay before you a definite plan for meeting this great want without further delay.

The building of the Waiwakaibo bridge is progressing favourably. This bridge so seriously needed will prove of great benefit; but it cannot be disguised that the construction of so extensive a work is a serious drain on our limited resources.

It is satisfactory to state that, with the exception of a Dog Registration Ordinance, the Ordinances of the last session, most of which largely affecting local interests, have been allowed by his Excellency the Governor, namely:—

1. Roads and Bridges
2. Declaratory Roads and Bridges
